Her previous roles include serving as chief senior assistant district attorney in the White Collar Unit of the Fulton County District Attorney's Office, and as an associate in an Am Law 200 firm where she practiced in the General Litigation Group and on the firm's National Appellate Team. Kimberly began her legal career in public service as a prosecutor, and previously worked at the U.S. Capitol, U.S. Department of Justice, as well as several non-profit policy organizations in Washington, DC before attending law school.

Recognized as one who is "On the Rise" by the *Fulton Daily Report*, Kimberly has expertise in Georgia's elder and disability law, business crimes, fraud, and financial investigations. She is an adjunct professor of White Collar Prosecution and Trial Practice at the University of Georgia School of Law, and she currently serves on the Consumer Advisory Board for the Office of the Attorney General of Georgia.
